First plan that you need to have is the Blue Angel Beach Show weekend. I recommend that you get out. But if you don't get out, then double tie your lines and center your boats in the slip. If anyone wants to volunteer to be on the storm prep team, then please let us know.

We have had some issues with the power in the dry slips. We have identified the problem and are working to correct it. Thank you for letting us know of this issue. As far as the dry slips, we currently have six members on the waiting list. We were able to clear several people off of the list in the past couple of months. However, we keep growing in membership.

As for the wet slips, we have three available on the East side. (5,7,17). Of course we have the transient slips available. West side slips are full, with two members waiting. There are also transient slips available on the west side.

We recently re-lined the daily trailer parking area. Please try to park inside the lines. Also, please back your trailer in as far as it will go. Meaning, putting your tires to the bumper piling. Please be mindful in all parking areas that you are not blocking anyone. This may mean disconnecting your vehicle from your trailer.

With the upcoming fireworks show on 4th of July, we will need a couple of volunteers to work the parking lot. We can utilize the church parking lot as well. You can park down in front of the dry stored boats. However you may get firework debris on your vehicles. We will also need a couple of volunteers for the fire watch on the docks. Please let me know of your availability.

House Rules for Grand Lagoon Yacht Club

The Grand Lagoon Yacht Club (The GLYC) and all the facilities of The GLYC are primarily for the use, entertainment, and enjoyment of the members and their families and guests. The House Rules of The GLYC are designed to facilitate and promote this purpose. The House Rules and any additions thereto are established and may be revised by the Board of Governors subject to the direction and approval of the Board of Governors. Members should be aware that:

- These rules are enforceable by any Board Member, Manager or Flag Officer present.
- Delinquency in financial obligations will result in denial of club privileges and possible expulsion from The GLYC.
- Any complaints, requests, or suggestions must be directed to the Board of Governors in writing.
- Violations of any of the rules will result in action by the Board of Governors concerning the member(s) will be allowed a hearing and the Board of Governors' action may be appealed. However, if the member(s) in. Question is on the Board, he/she will not be allowed to vote in the appeal.
- Rules will be posted at all times.

HOUSE RULES (revised 2/25/2024)

- 1. Members are responsible for signing in their non-member guests. The GLYC member shall be responsible for the guest's conduct, and the guest shall leave when the member leaves The GLYC.
- 2. Non-members that are not the immediate family of a member and live within 50 mile radius of the Club will be allowed in the Club no more than ten (10) times per year. Members of other reciprocal yacht clubs, providing proof of membership, are not considered guests. Transients temporarily renting a slip are allowed access to the club during the rental period. Frequent guests will be encouraged to join the club. When a violation is brought to the attention of the Board, the guest book will be reviewed by two Board members and action will be taken.
- 3. Prior members who have resigned from The GLYC and were not in good standing cannot be a guest of another member.
- 4. A person whom a member is dating is considered a guest, but the date may use the facilities of The GLYC as often as the date is accompanied by the member, provided that the date abides by all the rules and regulations of The GLYC.
- 5. Be appropriately dressed while in the Club. No bathing suits, tank tops, or bare feet in the Club. Be at least casually dressed in good taste during the dining room hours.
- 6. Observe current opening and closing hours.
- 7. Refrain from offensive language, conduct, or intoxication. If offensive, a member may be asked to leave the premises by The GLYC management or Flag Officer and is expected to do so at once.
- 8. Refrain from going behind the bar, entering the galley during operation, or otherwise interfering with bar/galley functions.
- 9. Purchase all alcoholic beverages to be consumed on premises from the bar.
- 10. Be accountable for the conduct of your children. Children are not allowed at the bar other than the service station and must leave the area immediately after purchase.
- 11. Refrain from littering on the premises.
- 12. Members are accountable for their pets and their conduct; they must be on a short leash and in designated areas: downstairs, parking lot, east-side of upper deck.
- 13. Do not take club property (eg. Glassware, china, silverware, etc) beyond the dock.
- 14. Refrain from smoking, including e-tobacco products, "vaping," or use of all other tobacco products inside the club house.
